A choice of pre-conference tours have been developed for NAITC participants and guests.

One tour will take us to **Rocky Mountain National Park**, the **Stanley Hotel** and allow a couple of hours to shop in **Estes Park**. You'll learn about their businesses and get to work since they need to get things done in June. This is a hands-on experience. Each farmer/rancher host will accommodate two teachers. This is an opportunity to ask questions and learn first-hand.

This post-conference tour will have us visiting the Anheuser Busch research facility and brewery near Wellington and then we'll mosey into town to one of the Micro-Breweries that are putting Fort Collins on the map. We'll do a little learnin' and do a little samplin'.

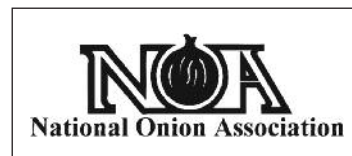

NAITC Annual Meeting: For members of AITC NAITC only. This is the annual meeting.

Exhibits: These are state booths and commercial booths. Exhibitors set up on Tuesday afternoon or before 7:00 am Wednesday. Exhibits are on-going throughout the conference. Water Festival exhibit tables will join the displays on Friday. Exhibit take down follows the conference conclusion Friday.

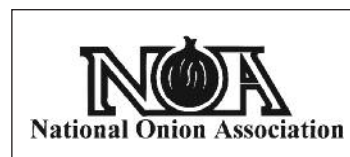
Teachers Only: Work on a Farm or Ranch. What a rare opportunity to spend a day with a working farmer or rancher. See their operation. Get your hands dirty. Get answers to your questions directly from someone living and working with agriculture.

Water Festivals: 30-minute workshops presented by a cadre of Colorado water festival participants and organizers. Each session will provide you with a lesson linking water, agriculture and natural resources. Fun, educational activities focusing on the science of water with an emphasis on upstream-downstream considerations.

Welcome to the West Dinner: Guests can purchase tickets to attend. Enjoy a variety of Colorado foods prepared by Colorado Commodity Organizations and the Colorado Chef's Association. A country-western band, Native American dancers, line dancing and a live auction will entertain throughout.

Workshops: These are structured like the Mini-Workshops. Additional time allows presenters to provide more in-depth information about their topics and methodology. Workshops are 90-minute sessions. Grade level appropriate with specific academic subject areas noted. The list of topics and presenters will be available January 2012.

Workshop-on-Wheels: Guests can purchase tickets to attend. The buses will load at the hotel entrance. You will have pre-selected your tour. Your bus will be easily identified and there will be volunteers on hand to help. Tours are topical in nature. For instance, the Agri-Tourism tour will visit sites that are agriculture based but for whom the main income is generated through agri-tourism activity. The sites included on this tour are Harvest Farm, Terry Bison Ranch, Bee Family Farm Museum and Cozy Cow Dairy. Buses will be stocked with water and snacks. Lunch will be provided.
