- Teach in one of the following rural counties in Washington State: Adams, Clallam, Columbia, Ferry, Garfield, Grant, Grays Harbor, Island, Jefferson, Kittitas, Klickitat, Lewis, Lincoln, Mason, Okanogan, Pacific, San Juan, Wahkiakum, Whitman
- Teach at least 3 periods of high school science, technology, engineering or math
- Agree to share their POGIL experience with one other STEM teacher in their county
